Sports Premium Report

2020 – 2021

PE Sports premium has been awarded to schools to support the development and wider participation in sporting activities. The PE and Sports leader, along with staff and children, has developed the following vision:

To ensure that all children have access to high quality and physical education and school sport. We believe that PE and sport, if taught well, makes a significant contribution to our pupil's personal well-being, academic development and enjoyment of school life. We aim to establish a culture in which all pupils, and the wider community, will engage in physical activity, raise their attainment, extend their potential and develop a life-long active lifestyle.

The emphasis this year is stream-lining and using out Sport Premium budget effectively, only buying into quality teaching and providing a variety of sporting opportunities throughout the school.

Funding received: £17,476 Expected funding approximately: £17,500 – each year
(April 2020 – March 2021) (April 2021 – May 2022) (April 2022 – May 2023)

Aims of the grant:

Encourage all pupils to take part in regular physical activity

- Sports coaches have been employed to work with teachers in introducing new sport and dance opportunities. This includes:
- Grass Roots PPA cover delivering a range of sports games skills and lessons
- Yogabugs for EYFS and KS1
- Happy Feet Dance lessons for EYFS and KS1 – dance routine taught to children by Happy Feet Dance
- Hoopstarz
- B. Outdoors
- X2 basketball nets purchased for MUGGA
- After school clubs – Grass Roots gymnastics/multi-skills
- orienteering

Competitions which include:

Cross country, multiskills KS1 inter-school football (friendly games)

Extending school sports which include:

Sports activities for use at playtime, walk to school activities and after school clubs such as, dance, rugby and gymnastics.

- Transport to events and venues for sporting activity

Improve the skill level of staff teaching PE.

- Work with coaches (Grass Roots) and Heworth Grange to upskill and to raise confidence
- School buys into LA SLA for sport and PE which increases opportunities for participation, coaching, specific staff training and access to cluster competitions (when available)
- Sports leaders have attended development sessions in managing and leading PE and sport and in planning to ensure the best opportunities for everyone

- Upskill teaching assistants – rugby, orienteering and netball

Whole school improvement

- Inclusion in a wider range of activities has excellent health benefits and contributes to motivation, building self-esteem and confidence.
- Children have had opportunities to experience practical activities around healthy living, wellbeing and emotional development including cooking, yoga bugs, visits and visitors. Children can talk about what keeps them healthy and how important sporting and PE opportunities are to promote physical and mental health
- We encourage parental support for activities with information, competitions, festivals, attendance at sporting events, breakfasts which celebrate sporting and other events (when allowed – COVID 19 restrictions)
- Improve the profile of PE in school with team hoodies and kit, competitions, new sports and visitors, sports in school this year.

Outcomes:

- Wide range of sporting activities enjoyed by children
- Increased participation in competitions across the LA
- Improvement in skills and confidence of staff
- *Sports Council participating in the development of PE and sports in school*
- After school clubs being well attended and some over-subscribed
- Increased physical activity in the playground
- All Y5 children are swimmers and the majority are competent 25m swimmers and more
- Children have an excellent understanding about how to eat healthily and be well
- An increasing number of children do sports out of school at the local community centre and in local football and martial arts clubs
